Legislation Development

NRCA (Air Quality) Regulations, 2006

- Regulates air pollution from industrial sources defined as major and significant facilities
- Application for Licences (Air Pollutant Discharge Licences) are to be submitted in April 2008

Legislation Development

NRCA (Wastewater & Sludge) Regulations, drafting Instructions

- Regulates all Sewage and Trade Discharges from Treatment Plants
- Establishes Effluent Standards- sewage effluent standards, trade effluent standards, irrigations standards & biosolids/sludge standards

What is Pollution Prevention?

- Pollution prevention is the use of processes, practices, materials, and energy that avoid or minimize the creation of pollutants and waste created through inefficiently designed systems, processes or operations.
- Pollution prevention is a good business strategy as well as good environmental policy. It enables the efficient use of resources and minimizes environmental impacts of the manufacturing process while reducing cost and liability.
- Pollution prevention allows industry, on a company-wide or sitespecific basis, the flexibility to choose the best methods to reduce risk to the public, employees and the environment in the most costeffective manner.

Environmental Management Systems

- EMS is a management tool used to address the impacts of an organization's products, services and processes on the environment
- The branch promotes EMS in both the Public & Private sector and is currently involved in establishing an EMS within NEPA
