
THE WILD LIFE PROTECTION (AMENDMENT OF FIRST SCHEDULE) (No. 2) ORDER, 1999

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by section 3 of the Wild Life Protection Act, the following Order is hereby made:—

- This Order may be cited as the Wild Life Protection Act (Amendment of First Schedule) (No. 2) Order, 1999.
 - The First Schedule to the Wild Life Protection Act is amended—
 - (a) in Part II by deleting the words "Boundary of the Amity Hall, St. Catherine, Game Sanctuary" and the description thereof and substituting therefor the following—
 - " BOUNDARY OF THE AMITY HALL, ST. CATHERINE, GAME SANCTUARY

Starting at the point where the power transmission line crosses the Agricultural Development Corporation property at the eastern most boundary; then going westerly along the power transmission line to the point where it crosses the canal on that property; then south along the canal until it enters the sea at Galleon Harbour; then from the mouth of the canal at Galleon Harbour, in a straight line to Teal Point at Little Goat Island with geographical coordinates of 17:53' 118"N 77:04' 971"W; then to the point with geographical coordinates of 17:52' 779"N 77:04. 683"W; then generally south-easterly along the periphery of Little Goat Island and Great Goat Island to geographical coordinates 17:51' 843"N 77:02' 600"W; then north-north-easterly to the bar with geographical coordinates 17:53' 235"N 77:02' 125"W where Salt Island Creek enters the sea (this area includes a section of Galleon Harbour); then along the eastern bank of the creek in a north-easterly direction to the point where the Agricultural Development Corporation property boundary intersects it; then north along that boundary back to the starting point."

(b) in Part III by deleting the map headed "Amity Hall—St. Catherine" and substituting therefor the following—
